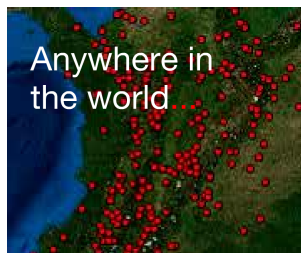

## Versatile AvantGuard tackles IEDs

G-NIUS Unmanned Ground Systems, a jointly owned company of Elbit Systems and Israel Aerospace Industries, is promoting its Avant-Guard unmanned ground combat vehicle on Stand D700 in Hall 6. G-NI US has revealed that its AvantGuard UGCV, based on the technological strength and capabilities of the company's Gardium UGV system, has been delivered to the IDF.

Employing a set of modular payloads, including ground-penetrating radar, counter-IED jammer, Mini-Pop cooled thermal surveillance camera, counter-human and vehicle detection radar, AvantGuard can be effectively deployed in a wide variety of combat missions. These include advance guard, armed sentry, combat logistic support, CASEVAC and more.

AvantGuard is controlled by a mobile or portable operational control unit, and can also operate in a follow-me mode, where it autonomously trails a guide foot soldier or vehicle.
